SONACOS: Twist around the resignation of the CEO, close to Ousmane Sonko

The resignation of the general director of SONACOS, El Hadji Ndane Diagne, is creating shock waves among workers, worried about the future of the company. In a context of restructuring, employees are warning of the risks of weakening recent achievements and asking for feedback on their decision.

The National Oilseed Marketing Company of Senegal (SONACOS) is going through a new zone of turbulence. The announcement of the resignation of its general director, El Hadji Ndane Diagne, presented in certain circles as close to Prime Minister Ousmane Sonko, provokes strong reactions within the company and staff. According to information relayed internally, this decision comes in a context of gradual restructuring of the company, marked by reforms initiated in recent months. But for worker representatives, a departure of the general director at this stage could weaken recent achievements. The unions and staff representatives welcome the recovery dynamic initiated since his arrival. They believe that several measures taken have made it possible to gradually revive the industrial activities of the SONACOS and to restore a climate of confidence within the peanut sector.

In this context, workers are warning of the risks of a breakdown in managerial continuity. They fear that the resignation of the general manager could compromise several ongoing strategic projects, essential to consolidating the performance of the public company. Faced with these concerns, an appeal was launched to El Hadji Ndane Diagne to reconsider his decision and continue the projects undertaken. For employees, the stability of governance appears today as a key factor in the continued recovery of SONACOS, a central player in the peanut sector in Senegal.
